
BIBLE TALK - CHOOSING TO BELIEVE

Introduction

For an ice-breaker, have everyone make a paper airplane and write their name and something they have a deep conviction about on it. On cue, everyone tosses their airplane around the room. If you find an airplane, pick it up and keep throwing it for 1-2 minutes. At the end of that time, everyone should have one paper airplane. Have everyone read the name and conviction on the plane.

Hebrews 11:1-6

Q: How would you define the word “assurance”?

Q: What are some of the things today which you hope for?

Q: What are some of the reasons it is hard to believe in something that you cannot see?

Q: As bible believers, what are some things we believe in which we “cannot see”?

Q: When it comes to people, when might you believe someone or disbelieve them?

What gives someone credibility?

Acts 2:37-38

Q: Why is it sometimes hard to “hear” what God wants to communicate to us?

Q: What does “cut to the heart” mean?

Q: Can you share of a time when you were cut to the heart? What was the result?

Q: What should be our response to the word of God?

Romans 8:38-39 - *For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.*

As we see in these passages, a biblical conviction is an unchangeable, deeply held belief, which involves a heart-felt response to God.
